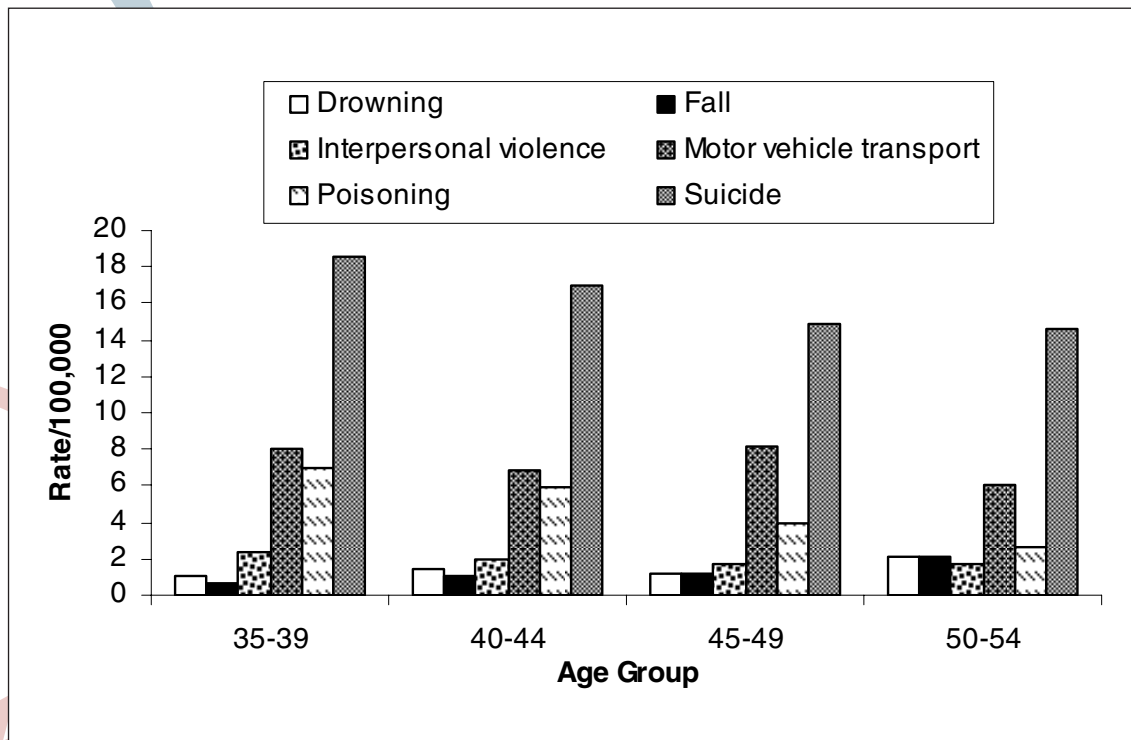


INJURY DEATH RATES IN PEOPLE AGED 35-54 YEARS IN NEW SOUTH WALES BY CAUSE OF INJURY: 1998-2002



- Suicide was the leading cause of injury death.
- Motor vehicle transport was the second leading cause of injury death, but the age-specific rates were much smaller compared to the rates for suicide.
- Poisoning was the third leading cause of injury death, but showed decreasing death rates with increasing age.
