TRENDS IN INTERPERSONAL

VIOLENCE DEATHS IN NEW SOUTH WALES

- ➤ Interpersonal violence was the fifth leading cause of injury death in NSW from 1998 to 2002.
- ➤ Between 1998 and 2002, 513 people died as a result of interpersonal violence in NSW.
- ➤ There was a statistically significant decline in interpersonal violence death rates in NSW from 1986 to 2002.

Yearly trend in death rates for interpersonal violence: NSW, 1986-2002

- ➤ People aged under five years and 30-34 years had the highest rates of death due to interpersonal violence in NSW from 1998 to 2002.
- Males accounted for 70% of all interpersonal violence deaths in NSW in NSW from 1998 to 2002.
- ➤ From 1998 to 2002, sharp or blunt objects (43%) and firearms (21%) were the most common causes of interpersonal violence-related death in NSW.
