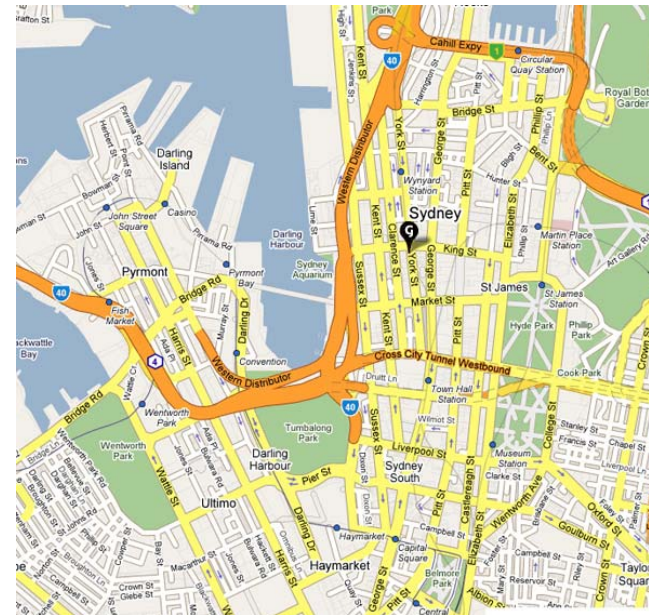

## Map & Directions



The Grace Hotel is located on the city block bordered by York, King and Clarence Streets.

Guests are just moments away from the Queen Victoria Building, Darling Harbour, Sydney Opera House, luxury shopping precincts, theatres and more. Cabs, buses and trains are at the door and everything you need is at your fingertips.

The closest train station is Wynyard. The Grace Hotel is a short five minute walk south from the York Street exit. If buses are the preferred transport option, many CBD bus routes arrive minutes from the venue via the Wynyard or QVB interchanges.

## Parking

Plaza Parking is located beneath the Grace Hotel with its entrance on Clarence Street. There are limited car spaces and they are available on a first-in basis. The day rate is \$30.00 per car, per day, for all conference guests. This is payable to Plaza Parking.

There is also parking available at the Queen Victoria Building nearby.
